A very naughty thief has stolen the Queen's handbag! There's only one thing to do: chase the thief all over the landmarks of Great Britain! Hold on to your hats and join the Queen in this epic wild goose chase after one sneaky swan by car, motorbike, plane, boat, and more to get her handbag back!

We have tried to make it as flexible as possible for you. We have come up with some suggested activities but please feel free to come up with any of your own or go with the children's interests. Please remember to use Letters and Sounds home learning You tube videos (Phase 5 - Year 1). If you want additional work you can also access Oak National Academy resources (link on our website) for each specific year group. These are just ideas that we hope will be helpful. You can choose to do any of them, as and when you would like to. 😊

English

- Can you find all the **verbs of movement** (e.g. **drove, rode**) from the text? Can you add your own to the list? What do you notice about these verbs?
- Play 'Guess my **verb**' -chirades style game (make some verb picture cards to help you play this game)
- Can you create an alternative story maybe a different item is stolen from the Queen by a different thief? Maybe the Queen chases the thief in a

different location? Can you draw a story map for your new story? Can you use your story map to write a new story?

- Find out what **prepositions** are (see links below). Can you draw some pictures to show a preposition word. Then write a sentence for each picture?
- Can you find the **preposition** words in the story? Look/pause at a page from the story. Can you say/write a sentence including a preposition word for this page?
- *A sneaky swan swooped* is a good example of **alliteration** - <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zfkk7ty/articles/zq4c7p3>. Find out what we mean by alliteration.
- Can you create some more alliterative phrases using this pattern? Maybe you could think of other animals or even use your own name to write a phrase or a sentence.
- *Can you write an alliterative name/animal alphabet e.g. Angry Adam etc?*
- Can you write the story from the Queen's point of view using first person verb tense I ? What happened first, next, then?
- What's inside the Queen's handbag? - write a description, remember to use **adjectives**.

- Can you investigate which materials make the best boat?

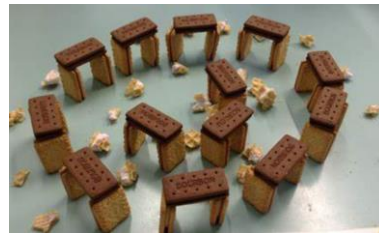


Computing

- Research the flags of the different countries of the United Kingdom and how the union flag is made up. Can you make a flag that represents you/your family?
