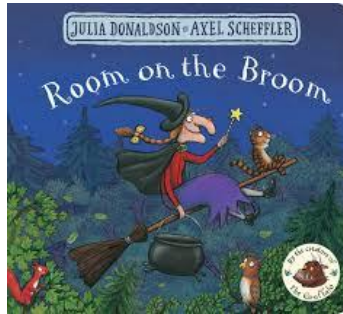


W/C: 4.05.20 Room on the Broom by Julia Donaldson
